Introduction – Finding the Context of the Narrative
Community Life Group Questions

1. We said Sunday the Story of the Bible is Geography, politics, economics, hills & valleys, towns and cities, etc. Can you think of a Bible story where you know this is the case or where one of several of these “context” items comes into play? What is it? How is the story affected by the context of those things?

2. What are your thoughts about the quotes from Bill Hybell’s? Where does the evangelism of the church happen most and most effectively? When does it happen the most and the most effectively? How might either understanding, or not have a solid understanding of the Story we profess to believe and be a part of affect our interaction with unbelievers?

3. Read II Chron. 34:1-7. We discussed this passage in church just a couple weeks ago. Read verses 5-6 again. Where are these places? Some of you probably have maps in the backs of your Bibles. What can you glean about these verses from where these places mentioned are located? How do they help understand this passage better?
